

Notelaea longifolia

(Oleaceae)

- Common name:** Large mock-olive.
- Localities:** Brisbane River Bank, Kholo Creek, Priors Pocket, Upper Brookfield.
- Growth form:** A shrub or small tree to 7 m tall.
- Foliage:** Leaves simple, thick and leathery, up to 16 cm long and 5.5 cm wide, tapering to the petiole.
- Flowers and fruit:** Inflorescences are very short and the flowers are minute and pale yellow. The fruit is bluish-black, 1-1.5 cm long.
- Habitat:** Occurs in subtropical and dry rainforest, and also in eucalypt forest.
- Propagation and Management:** Propagated from seed. Large mock-olive is a species which is easy to grow and tolerates neglect.
- General:** The fruit attract birds.
