

Owenia venosa
(Meliaceae)

- Common name:** Crow's apple.
- Localities:** Grandview Rd, Priors Pocket, Savages Rd, Upper Brookfield.
- Growth form:** A small or medium tree, with a spreading crown and very scaly, greyish bark.
- Foliage:** Leaves are pinnate, with 6 or 8 leathery, more-or-less opposite leaflets up to 9 cm long, 3 cm wide.
- Flowers and fruit:** The many-flowered panicles are produced from spring to summer, the individual flowers with white petals 5 mm long. These are followed by reddish globular fruit 2-3 cm in diameter, each containing a single hard seed.
- Habitat:** Common in dry rainforest.
- Propagation and Management:** Propagated from suckers, or seed, which does not germinate readily. Requires good drainage and some shade.
- General:** A slow-growing species.
