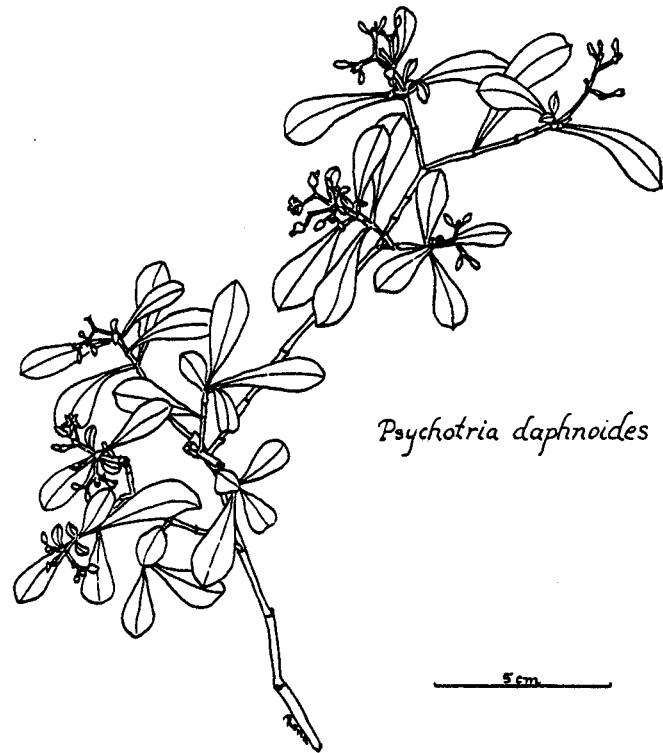


Psychotria daphnoides

(Rubiaceae)

- Common name:** Smooth psychotria.
- Localities:** Moggill State Forest.
- Growth form:** A small, neat shrub with attractive foliage.
- Foliage:** Leaves are simple and opposite, up to 8 cm long, broadest near the tip and tapering to the base, paler on the under surface.
- Flowers and fruit:** Tiny white flowers appear in spring. These are followed by round, whitish or yellowish ribbed berries about 5 mm in diameter.
- Habitat:** Dry rainforest.
- Propagation and Management:** May be propagated from fresh seed, and from cuttings, which strike slowly. A hardy species which requires well-drained soil.
- General:** The fruit is edible, and attracts birds. Smooth psychotria may be grown on stony soils.
