Tabernaemontana pandacaqui

(Apocynaceae)

Common name:

Banana bush.

Localities:

Gold Creek, Savages Rd, Upper Brookfield.

Growth form:

A shrub or small tree to about

4 m tall.

Foliage:

Leaves are simple and opposite, with short petioles, tapering at either end

and up to 9 cm long.

Flowers and fruit:

Flowers are scented and are single in

leaf axils. They are followed by paired banana-shaped fruit which turn

yellow as they mature.

Habitat:

Subtropical and dry rainforest.

Propagation and Management:

May be propagated from fresh seed

or cuttings. Banana bush is a quick-growing

shrub tolerant of infertile soils.

General:

This is a very ornamental shrub which

is well worth growing. Until recently, the banana bush was known as

Ervatamia angustisepala. Despite the common name, the fruit are not edible.
