

Acronychia pauciflora

(Rutaceae)

Common name: Soft acronychia.

Localities: Savages Road.

Growth form: A shrub or small tree.

Foliage: Leaves are simple, opposite, 5-10 cm long, and the tip is rounded or bluntly pointed. They are pale and sometimes softly hairy on the under surface, and are aromatic when crushed.

Flowers and fruit: The cream-coloured flowers are in small clusters in leaf axils. The fruit is white and rounded, 4-lobed, and about 8 mm long.

Habitat: Subtropical and dry rainforest.

Propagation and Management: Seed is difficult to germinate. Soft acronychia requires good drainage and is slow-growing.
